

Y5/6 Fairbourne Residential 2017

Day 1

- Children arrive at school at the normal time in their own clothes
- Overnight bags are taken to the hall and should be labelled with the children's name. Any medication should be given to the first aider on the trip at this point and should be labelled. Children with inhalers, should keep them themselves in their day bags.
- Children then keep their day bags with them and go up to their classroom
- Leave for Fairbourne at approx. 9.30am - parents welcome to stay and wave children off
- Arrive in Fairbourne at approx. 11.30
- Fieldwork - mapping, photo-trail etc

Day 1 continued

- Lunch followed by building rock shelters
- Further fieldwork then walk up to the Blue Lake
- Arrive at Panteinion Hall - sort rooms, evening meal, evening activities
- Hot or cold drink before bed

Overnight bag

- Sleeping bag (attached to overnight bag)
- Day and night clothes
- Large towel
- Strong trainers/walking boots - no slippy soles please
- Slippers/indoor shoes
- Teddy bear
- Toiletries

Day 1

Day bags

- Rucksack - two shoulder straps
- Packed lunch for day 1 (day 2 and 3 lunch provided)
- Refillable drinks bottle labelled with child's name
- Field notebook and pencil (provided by school)
- Fully waterproof coat
- Money (no more than £5) and camera (at parents' discretion)

Day 2

- Breakfast
- Walk from Panteinion Hall to Fairbourne
- Continue to walk from Fairbourne along the dyke to Morfa Mawddach station - children have snack
- Continue walk along Barmouth bridge over the estuary to Barmouth
- Once in Barmouth eat lunch then carry out several fieldwork activities
- Children then given some shopping time to spend their money (small gift shop also available at Panteinion hall for souvenirs)

Day 2 continued

- Free time on the beach
- Catch train back to Fairbourne
- Walk back up to Panteinion Hall for evening meal
- Showers - children with long hair need a shower cap
some rooms are en-suite (girls)
separate shower room (boys)
staff wait outside whilst all children shower one at a time
all children stay in their rooms until everyone is showered
- Evening activities - shop/quiz/disco
- Hot/cold drink before bed

Day 3

- Pack cases and sleeping bags
- Breakfast
- Clear all rooms
- Leave hall and walk to Fairbourne
- Trip on miniature steam railway to sand spit
- Return to station
- Walk through Fairbourne back to sea wall for lunch
- Leave Fairbourne at approx. 2pm
- Return to school by 4pm

Additional information

- Rooms - mixture of single and bunk beds. Some larger and some smaller rooms are available. Children are asked beforehand who they would like to share with and whether they would like a larger or smaller room
- Sweets - Parents can send their children with sweets at their own discretion, however we ask that you send no more than one small Haribo sized bag
- No electronic devices please including mobile phones
- Medical form will be sent out before the trip and includes any dietary requirements - all requirements can be catered for by the centre
- Code of conduct - this is for parents and children to sign and return to school agreeing to acceptable behaviour and following safety instructions during the trip
